JOB DESCRIPTION FOR TUTOR TTI

Overall responsibility: Tutors at Solidarity Teacher Training College teach any of the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Christian Religious Education, Professional Education Studies, Computer, Art, Music, Health and Physical Education.

Qualifications: Bachelor Degree in Education (at least)

Accountability: To the Principal and her/his delegate

Expected duties:

1. Fully participate in the Solidarity Teacher Training College meetings and activities.
2. Act in accordance with the Policies, Rules and Regulations of the STTC.
3. Plan lessons in accordance with the South Sudan Government Curricula.
4. Participate in evaluating and reviewing Curricula when required.
5. Ensure that proper class teaching takes place as per the time table and the subject allocated to you in accordance with the Curricula.
6. Ensure that you fill in the class roll sheet at the beginning of each class.
7. Maintain good collaboration with other tutors within the school.
8. Carry out continuous assessment as per the course content covered to ascertain that theoretical knowledge is accurately assimilated by the students as per the set objectives and the curricula contents. Continuous assessment takes 40% of the total marks.
9. Ensure that all marks for continuous assessments are accurately recorded and passed on to the Deputy Principal.
10. Write and edit all end-of-term exams in your subject area.
11. Invigilate end-of-term exams.
12. Maintain accurate records of lesson plans, assessments and assignments.
13. Participate in all staff development workshops arranged by the Administration.
14. Assist with Graduation preparations.
15. Take a turn at College Library supervision in the evening.
16. Supervise students on Teaching Practice in local schools.

17. Any other duties deemed necessary by the Principal and Deputy Principal which falls within your training.
18. Support the ethos of Solidarity as a College for South Sudanese and Sudanese students.

Other basic information

The position applies to religious, who are motivated by the mission statement of Solidarity with South Sudan.

You will be living away from your home country and in a country which is experiencing a fragile peace.

You will reside in an international and intercultural religious community of men and women.

In keeping with our surroundings, the standard of living practiced by Solidarity personnel is simple.

In our relations with local people and institutions we seek to encourage empowerment of others and to avoid practices that may promote dependency.
